Lyndon Williams is a member of the Mount Vernon City Council. He is running for re-election to the City Council in 2005. He served as City Council President in 1997 and 2001 under the Council's rotary systems and is presently the President Pro- Temp. He expects to serve as City Council President in the year 2006.

Mr. Williams held several major leadership positions in City government including Chairman of the City's Capital Projects Board; Vice-President of the Mount Vernon Urban Renewal Agency; Chairman of the City Council's Public Safety and Code Committee, Finance and Planning Committee, and Legislation and Public Works Committee, and sponsored major legislation in the areas of economic development, housing, crime prevention, and finance and budget.

He believes that economic development in the City of Mount Vernon is vital to maintaining a strong commercial tax base, economic stability, and employment opportunities for Mount Vernon residents. He sponsored and supported legislation that enabled the continuing revitalization of Sanford Boulevard where new businesses like Target, Best Buy, Bed Bath & Beyond, TJ Max and other major retail establishments are now located.

Mr. Williams has been a strong advocate for low property taxes, improved quality of life, and safe and secure neighborhoods. He has worked for improved recreational activities for children and young adults, and has advocated for better education for our children in the school system.

He has sponsored and supported major crime prevention legislation including closing 24-hour bodegas to prevent loitering for drugs activities, community policing, better housing standards for tenants, revitalization of Levister Towers – the city's largest public housing complex, improved recycling and garbage pick up, the more trees planted in public streets, better streets and sidewalks, stopping a major gas pipeline from coming through Mount Vernon, and many other quality of life issues.

In addition to his political accomplishments, Mr. Williams has an impressive educational and professional background. He received his Bachelors of Business Administration in accounting from Bernard M. Baruch College; his MBA from Pace University Graduate School of Business; and his Juris Doctor from Pace University School of Law. He is also a Certified Public Accountant.

Mr. Williams is an attorney admitted to practice law in Courts of the States of New York and Connecticut; several Federal Courts; and the United States Supreme Court. He is presently a corporate lawyer for a major financial institution. He holds membership and affiliation with several professional organizations and has received numerous honors and awards.

Mr. Williams' civic involvement in the Mount Vernon community includes serving as member of the Board of Directors of the Boys & Girls Club of Mount Vernon, where he volunteers his legal expertise and services. He is a founder and board member of the African American Chamber of Commerce; volunteered legal services to establish the Levister Towers Community Development Corporation to ensure that resident-tenants play a central role in future plans for the housing complex. Mr. Williams is a member of the Mount Vernon NAACP; President of the Association of Black Lawyers of Westchester and supports several community-based organizations and activities. He serves as a role model and frequent speaker in Westchester Schools encouraging young people to stay in school.

Mr. Williams is married and has three children.
